

### Requirements for the composition and labelling of compound feed according to the bi-OS

These requirements apply for producers of commercial compound feed.

#### Ingredients

#### Composition

##### 1. Composition for labelling as “organic”

All ingredients of agricultural origin are organic
At least 95 % of the total dry matter (including minerals and additives) are organic agricultural products

## 2. Composition for labelling as “**may be used in organic production**”

*Maximum percentages indicated refer to requirements for livestock feeding rations, and are provisions for livestock producers. For complementary feeding stuff, percentages may be higher, but must be clear from the labelling so that livestock producers may calculate correct feeding rations.*

Organic agricultural products may be less than 95 % of the total dry matter (including minerals and additives)
In conversion agricultural products < 30% of ingredients of agricultural origin (relevant for complete feed)
Protein ingredients of non-organic plant and animal origin < 5 % of dry matter of feed from agricultural origin in 12 months (relevant for complete feed)
Non-organic spices, herbs and molasses < 1 % of dry matter of feed from agricultural origin in 12 months (relevant for complete feed)

## Labelling

*General labelling requirements for organic products apply. Additionally, there are the following particular requirements for feed:*

### 1. Labelling requirements for “**organic**” labelling

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Description or name of the animal feeding stuff <i>separate from product name and product description and presented in a colour, format or character font that does not draw more attention to it than to the description or name of the animal feedingstuff:</i></li> <li>• Reference to organic production method</li> <li>• EU organic logo (optional)</li> <li>• bio.inspecta’s CB code XX-BIO-161</li> <li>• weight (dry matter)</li> <li>• % ingredients of agricultural origin</li> <li>• % of other ingredients</li> <li>• list of names of organic ingredients</li> </ul>
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### 2. Labelling requirements for “**may be used in organic production**” labelling
